Women's centre now open

Thanks to a grant from the United Way of Hamilton-Wentworth and Burlington, the Women's Centre, Halton Multicultural Council and Halton Women's Place are setting up a satellite office in Burlington.

Located at Upper Canada Place, 460 Brant Street, Suite 206, the Women's Centre will be offering a variety of services for women in Burlington and a settlement worker from the Halton Multicultural Council will be available to assist new Canadians settle in Halton.

On Wednesdays, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., staff and volunteers from the Women's Centre will be available to talk to women over the phone or in person. Women are encouraged to drop-in and chat.

For women looking for work, Building Blocks to Employment will be running on Thursday evenings, starting Oct. 26. This four-week program helps you better understand your skills, interests and aptitudes. A nominal fee is charged for these programs but no one will be turned away because of financial difficulties.

An open house was held this week with ribbon cutting ceremonies with Jodi Orr, Executive Director of the United Way of Hamilton-Wentworth Burlington. Women in the community are invited to drop-in and learn more about the programs.
